- 4. OLD BUSINESS
 - a. ARMER Update (Marcus Bruning)
 - i. Bill Bernhjelm's contract ran out June 30, 2011; contract will be updated after state shutdown
 - ii. Sales Tax Exemptions; still being considered
 - iii. State did build patches for 3100 and 2700 district; patch to local talk group; Duluth PD, Carlton County, Pine County, Cook County; Lake County; unsure about Koochiching County; no construction being done at this time; construction projects ended about 3 weeks before state shutdown in July; hopefully contractors will soon be back to finish construction
 - iv. Looks like ARMER 911 funds will not be taken away
 - Change in Agenda Owners and Operators (Steve Olson)
 - o NECOM Talk Group Standard; between PSAPs

b. Jurisdictional Updates/Representatives

- i. Cook County (Mark Falk); county board is concerned about the cost of maintaining ARMER as they have heard rumors that it could be a couple hundred thousand a year which is much higher than what is being paid now for VH systems; commissioner also heard that counties are pulling out from joining ARMER because of the cost; (Bruce Hegrenes) some agencies may have significant local enhancement sites that they built and would be responsible to maintain; if the state builds the infrastructure the state pays for it; suggest discussion with Bill or Tim Lee regarding this issue; software license agreement is not a requirement for Motorola portables; each upgrade can be purchased at time of upgrade; (Mark Falk) Where are we at with Joint Powers Agreements as Grant Portage is asking; (Scott Camps) the process for getting the regional tribes onto the board is still in the process; we will work on and getting moving forward; (Tom Hannon) All the parties of the Joint Powers Agreement have approved the modifications and all that is needed is for the RRB to adopt the policies for application for membership; application will be reviewed by the policy committee in the near future. (Steve Olson) requests Grand Portage to make appointments to the user and owners committees
- ii. Crow Wing (Rey Freeman); Motorola has provided proposal to county for system infrastructure and implementation; working on issue surrounding getting a local enhancement tower site developed on the east side of the county
- iii. Aitkin County (Rey Freeman); enlisted GeoComm for project management; project kickoff was a little over a month ago; working on state requirements for Motorola
- iv. Mille Lacs (Monte Fronk); draft of talk groups put together; working with OnTarget Consulting Group; once Aitkin and Pine counties create talk groups we will work with them to add them; ready to go
- v. Kanabec County (Jeff Anderson); have all portables; no mobiles as waiting for grant money; 2 of 3 towers are up and running; because of state shutdown construction stopped on 3rd tower; waiting for the 3 control stations to finish the work on our PSAPs; hope to go live with portables soon
- vi. City of Duluth; waiting on state before working on tower site; waiting for grant fund approval
- vii. Lake County; waiting on several sites; process of purchasing radios; waiting on numbers for dispatch console
- viii. St. Louis County (Bruce Hegrenes); worked on some projects during state shutdown; got leases in place on tower sites; finished state requirements and in the process of looking at what is going to be required for our systems; county decided to consolidate 2 PSAPs into 1 PSAP in the Duluth Public Safety building
- ix. State Patrol; Virginia Office was the last to migrate onto ARMER; everything went smooth and working great, clear channels
- x. Grand Portage (Mike Keyport); looking to having resolution taken care of
- xi. Itasca County; no report
- xii. Leech Lake (Terry O'Connor); 2/3 of equipment has been purchased; still moving forward with Participation Plan; contracted GeoComm; lining people up for committees; still lacking system administrator training; (Chris Lentz) there is a

- system admin. training next week in Wilmar; unsure as to open spots; there a prerequisite classes that must be completed before attending the training

- xv. Pine County (Rey Freeman); GeoComm has be contracted for project management; kickoff was in earlier in July; starting to move forward

 funding; 2011 Homeland Security Grant; state allocation was cut in half; unsure as to whether
 the recommendation of the grant workgroup was approved by the SRB

All individual agencies and other regions are requesting our talk groups; does it make sense to work with other regions to get approval for everyone to program the NE talk groups in the other regions as this may save a lot of paperwork; state requirements are that the owners of the talk groups have to approve of anyone else programing their talk groups; (Marcus) suggest bringing this to Bill's attention when he gets back; RRB does allow the chair of the RAC to approve them as they come through

 - i. The recommendation of the State Patrol when working directly with an agency is that they will be working on the LTAC or STAC . The local agency will be responsible to patch it to local talk groups when working with the State Aviation Unit; addresses what needs to be put into local CAD systems for documentation; informational only no action necessary

 users committees and approved by the RAC and NE RRB need to be forwarded to the SRB for

- approval; (Tom Hannon) they do not need to go to state for approval as they are local standards which should not conflict with existing state standards
